## COURSE DESCRIPTION

Intermediate Intensive Spanish Course is aimed at providing basic intermediate level (B1) lexical and communication tools that allow students to improve the use of Spanish during their stay and interactions in Chile and acquire cultural knowledge that facilitates language acquisition in real context.

At the end of the course, the student will be able to understand main points of clear texts related to topics of interest; it will be able to operate in most urban transactions; will be able to produce simple and coherent texts on familiar topics and will be able to describe experiences, events, desires, aspirations, opinions and plans.

# LEARNING GOALS

- 1. Acquire lexical resources for content description.
- 2. Narrate facts and express reasons and circumstances.
- 3. Integrate grammatical structures for the expression of desires and opinions.
- 4. Participate satisfactorily in conversations on daily and general topics.
- 5. Use resources of social interaction culturally appropriate according to context.

#### **METHODOLOGY AND ACTIVITIES**

Interactive classes with activities for the systematization, practice and application of learned structures. Development of cultural guides to be applied in activities outside the class. Role play activities, personal research, creation of dialogues, individual and group work. Short essays, tasks for vocabulary acquisition and oral presentations.

## CONTENT

The course is organized in cultural units that aim to help the process of immersion and learning of the language in context. For the above, the course includes activities with tutors in the field, which will serve both to acquire cultural knowledge in the field, and to apply the uses of language in real context.
