## COURSE DESCRIPTION

The GO Sustainability & Environment program provides a unique experience for students to learn about climate change, renewable energies, future development challenges and the impact of youth on this topic. ## METHODOLOGY AND ACTIVITIES

## Online: Environment & Sustainable Development Challenges

The first week of the program will be held in January for 5 consecutive days in an online format.

This week will cover interesting topics and group activities so that all members can get to know each other and share their knowledge and experiences on the subjects.

There will be 5 additional online sessions distributed from March to June, so that participants can continue learning and preparing for the presential section. There will be workshops by experts on each topic and dialogues between students in the classes and seminars. The purpose of these sessions during the semester is to enhance networking, contact and connection between the participants, and therefore, to form a consolidated group that, in July, will be able to visit our Campus at the feet of the snowy Andes Mountain.

## The second part of the program will take place in July 2021 for two weeks.

During this time, all the students will meet again to continue studying and training in Sustainability and Environment.
